ESCA Election Process

October is the start of the **ESCA** election process, with the appointment of a three-person **nomination committee** at the **first meeting in October**.

The nomination committee will call or email eligible members to obtain permission to put them on the slate for nomination to the Board.

The nomination committee will present their slate to the membership at the first meeting in November and then additional nominations can be presented at regular meetings.

To be eligible to run for an elective office, a person must be a Regular Active Member, and have been in the club for over 6 months. The minimum age for an elective officer is eighteen.

If you have never been an elected Officer and would like to find out what it is all about, please call or talk to any current Officer.

Serving on the Board is a great way to get more involved in **ESCA** and help out your club. (Contact the **ESCA Secretary** if you need to know your membership status.)

We did have a lower then expected turn out but with a bit of a break in the heat and a simplified course provided by John Castellano we were able to run safely and had a ton of fun!!


With the lower turn out we decided to take a stab at gridding at the south end of the paddock. We had plenty of room and should be able to do this with twice the cars in the future.

Charlie Sawyer took his first top time of day with his newly built Exoskeletor car, followed VERY closely behind by Ben Bettega in his Focus RS, and Mike McCrory and his little Honda-that-could, rounding out the top three spots.


If you missed this one be sure NOT to miss the **October** date as it will be a double points day!

Discover Mendocino on Oct. 15 & 16

Mendocino County - with its rugged coast line, redwoods, wineries, state parks and seriously good food – is the perfect destination for **ESCA**'s Fall Run, October 15-16, 2022. Come join us. **RSVP** to Marci secretary@empiresportscar.org

We'll meet at the Kaffee Mocha parking lot (397 Aviation Blvd., Santa Rosa, CA) at 9:45 am, and head out at 10:00 am.

Our route is pretty straight-forward, traveling up Highway 101 to Cloverdale. Then it's a quick jog on N. Cloverdale Boulevard to Oat Valley Road (also known as Highway 128 and passed Boonville becomes Anderson Valley Highway). We'll stop at the Navarro Vineyards and Winery for a break. The final leg begins at the Navarro River Bridge, where Highway 128 joins Highway 1, heading north to Mendocino County.

"The ZONC President Linda Williams will be hosting a pot luck BBQ at her Fort Bragg home. Linda has plenty of room for cars and even more room for lunch guests on her spacious deck and back yard that adjoin the tree-laden Mitchell Creek. Mountain lions, and coyotes and bears. Oh, my! (Seriously... Linda has spotted, and video captured some pretty remarkable, wild neighbors roaming her property.)

Getting back to lunch, Linda suggests guests can bring side dishes and desserts. She will supply hamburgers, hot dogs, sausages and water." Linda and ZONC have graciously invited **ESCA** to join the BBQ. We will need to bring a side dish or dessert. Please let Marci know by 10-5-22 what you're bringing.

"Those planning on a one-day trip to Mendocino will still have time after lunch to visit the coast or head inland to one of the several state parks or other attractions before returning home.

Anyone planning to stay overnight and return home on the 16th should check out **ESCA**'s recommendation of The Hill House Inn (www.hillhouseinn.com) in the village of Mendocino. It's offering a "one-night" special rate for **ESCA** and ZONC members who mention **ESCA**. Marci suggests you book soon, as a limited number of rooms are being held for that weekend.

Now that you have a room and an extra day, how about some things to do?

Within walking distance of the Hill House Inn is "downtown" Mendocino where you can peruse the book shops,


galleries, cafes and boutiques selling local goods. Head west a few blocks and you're in the Mendocino Headlands State Park (www.mendoparks.org/mendocino-headlands) with its bluffs overlooking the Pacific Ocean and Goat Island. (The goats are long gone.) Walk just south of town and dip your toes where the Big River meets the Pacific Ocean in Mendocino Bay. (Might be a bit chilly in October, but still...)

Nautical history buffs will enjoy the Point Cabrillo Light Station, www.pointcabrillo.org And horticulture enthusiasts will enjoy the Mendocino Coast Botanical Gardens, www. gardenbythesea.org

For additional "nature experiences," head two miles north of Mendocino to Russian Gulch State Park (www.meetmendocino. com/russian-gulch-state-park) where you'll find everything from headlands views to a fern canyon to a beautiful 36 foot waterfall. Take note, there is an \$8 cash entry fee per car. And make sure you bring layers of clothing for your outdoor activities. Fog is a constant companion along the Mendocino Coast in the mornings though it typically burns off through the day.

Probably the most unusual beach along this part of California's coast is Glass Beach (www.californiabeaches.com/ beach/glass-beach) in MacKerricher State Park. That's about a 15 minute drive north of Mendocino in Fort Bragg. Glass Beach doesn't look like much from above, but once you take the narrow path down to the sand you'll realize it's actually made up almost entirely of "seaglass" of all different shapes and colors. (Truth...It's the result of Mother Nature "cleaning up" after humans.)"

Come with **ESCA** and enjoy Fall in Northern California. Join us for our **October 15-16, 2022**, Mendocino Run.



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Victor's Journey (A Mini's Story) Part 1 of 3

The Journey Starts

There are times in my life when I am not aware that I have started a new journey and for sure I have no idea where it will take me. But it always starts with the first step. During these last three years I have been exposed to, for me, a new automobile experience-**Vintage Car Racing**. Since 2006 while dealing with maintenance and locating hard to find parts for my '67 Yellow Mini, I made the acquaintance of Mike Kearney of Seven Enterprises and Don Racine of Mini Mania. Each of them has over 40 plus years experience at all levels of racing Vintage Minis. Being around them was infectious!!! I already had the Mini addiction. Now It was only going to get a lot more intense.

The Car

I needed to find an original Mini with documented vintage racing history. I asked Mike and Don because they know everyone in the Mini world. So in Oct 2019 my search focused in on a Mini in Pennsylvania. The Mini had been totally sorted out and was ready to race. A 1275 cc. '65 Mk1 Austin Mini Cooper S. Included in the sale price was a '20 ft enclosed trailer, a spare Cooper S motor, many misc parts, wheels/tires, a log book with race history going back to 1976, and a "Family Name"-Victor. YES, this Mini came with a name and I was required to carry on the tradition. (this will require too long a story that I will save for another day). Forget the fact that I had no experience or idea how to do side-by-side racing. All I knew was I had the complete package and I was "open for business". However, paying for Victor was easier than getting him shipped from the East Coast. Starting with the worst winter in history and add CoVID 2019 and you can understand why I did not take delivery until April 2021.

Getting Experience

Obviously, when you start from the absolute bottom, it will take years to become a competent driver. But again, I needed to take the first step. Prior to ever driving on a track I knew I needed to study track maps and watch virtual track walks with Ross Bentley @ Speed Secrets. Mike and Don suggested the 3 of us schedule a test and tune day at Thunderhill Raceway Park, Willows, CA in May. Mike was my Crew Chief, and Don was my Co Driver. Once Don had a chance to take Victor out for a shakedown run, and returned with a "Thumbs Up", I was given my "Marching "Orders". Decked out in my brand new Sparco driver suit/gloves/shoes, full face Bell helmet, Hans Device, and ear plugs I looked like a "real race car driver" as I crawled in "V" and buckled up.
