In a column the Chairman Terry Larson talked about the clubs up and down year, but said things were going to get better. Stating there would be another open autocross and a Tour/Rallye for club members. He also welcomed two new members, Marci Tarleton and Gary O'Connor into **ESCA**.

An Airport 81 article talked about the open event that had 43 drivers and just made the break even point. TTOD went to Scott Cattell in his modified Corvair, with Craig LaMothe, in his 240Z, second.

In a Surprise Open Autocross (Airport 81-A) article we learned there would be another open autocross at the Sonoma County Airport with a cost of (\$6) per driver plus one hour of work.

In a Marque of the Month article Bob the Beard talked about the Datsun 240Z. He talked about his Z, and the first Z sold in Santa Rosa to **ESCA** member B. Scott Foster, and some Z racing history.

An article called Second 50-mile Sonoma Valley Mystery History Scenery Appreciation and Wine Tasting Tour and Rally, by Terry Larson stated the event would start at 9:30am and have an enthusiast's section, some scenic sections and some historic sections and then some wine tasting sections, before breaking for a picnic lunch. Lunch was to be followed by a Beard type rally, which was to end at Mary's Pizza in Boyes Springs, which was to be followed by a sundown swim in the lake at the Larson's.

In 1984 I was building a '71 Torino to run at the Petaluma dirt track. I had the roll cage welded in, doors welded shut, suspension upgraded, glass and interior removed, race seat and belts installed when Terry announced "We're pregnant!" Needless to say the Torino went down the road to some lucky racer and my dreams of dirt oval greatness were dashed.

Many years later I told Terry that when the kids were grown and gone there would be a race car of some sort in the garage. I didn't know what it would be, just some sorta race car. I never dreamed it would be a 7 hp 'grandpa go-kart!

About a year and a half ago I came across cyclekarts.... home fabbed, Harbor Freight engined, 3/4 scale 1920's and 30's race cars on Honda wire wheels and very skinny tires. I saw that there was a meet at Laguna Seca in a few weeks so I got to work. I had my car ready to race in 17 days and I had it at the event and I was seriously hooked. They don't look that fast but when you're a few inches off the ground on those moped tires it'll get your attention.

They're pretty cheap to build and fun to drive but there is a down side. (of course!) Since it's a fairly new phenomenon the big events are all far away. As I type this I'm on my way home from a dirt oval event (38 years late!) north of Seattle and next weekend (5/19-20) I'm driving to Huntsville Utah for the biggest event in the country. There are supposed to be 60 karts in attendance!!

We had an event at the Sonoma County Fairgrounds in March and it rained most of the day but that only added to the fun, slip slidin' away. Next year we're running April 6th.... watch this space!!

#### Profile for Marci Jenkins

First, my name is Marcia Ann (not pronounced Marsha), because few people pronounce it correctly, I go by Marci. As a 5th generation Californian, I grew up in Sonoma County, when it was still small. I spent my teenage years swimming, reading, practicing the fire baton, working in the summer and cleaning out piston cylinders of the engines that my brother and his friends were rebuilding. My hand fit into the cylinders. I learned to drive on a 1965 El Camino truck with a slipping clutch. I got to drive a dump truck one week, lots of fun for a teenager, but my daily driver was a 1965 Mustang automatic. I hated that car - it could not get out of it's own way, although, I never was one to cruise 4th Street in my car.

After a year at SRJC I headed for the open seas. It was the Spring Semester of 1969 and 114 days of traveling and 16 units of classes. We left Long Beach, Ca headed to Japan via Hawaii, down the coast of Vietnam, Thailand, Ceylon, Bombay (visited the Taj Majal), from Kenya to Cape Town, to Morcco (missed the train to Marrakesh – I really did), to Spain, Portugal, and New York. I saw a lot and really learned to value different cultures and met many wonderful people.

Home again and car-less, I spent \$50 for a 1955 Pontiac – great trunk space to take to UC Davis. Soon upgraded to a 1966 Olds 442, when I transferred to Dominican College. I hated the two tone look so, I hand-sanded it on my summer break and a friend painted it a lovely dark metallic green. That was the only car I have actually spun out – rainy day on the exit ramp into San Rafael. Why I sold the 442 in 1972, I'll never know, especially, since I ended up with another \$100 car (\$50 car & \$50 engine) a Chevy Nova. A few months later I spent a little more and got the 1968 Cougar. By 1973 I was teaching elementary grades. I went on to earn a Masters and an Ed.D. in Education. I not only taught, but was also an Administrator in the County Special Education program. I retired in 2009.

In 1979 I moved into a duplex across the street from Gary O'Connor. This is important because meeting Gary lead me to join **ESCA** and meet my husband, Bob. (We were married in 1984 with the **ESCA** banner hanging in the church, seemed appropriate as I was Chairman of **ESCA** that year and we met through the club.) Gary helped me build my Kit Car, a 1952 MGTD on a VW frame. Another neighbor showed me how to wire the car, named the Glass Slipper. Unfortunately, the kit car was a mix of Lucas gages, mechanical gas tank and voltage. The 1st battery for it in 1983 was not the correct voltage and it took Bob and I about12 hours to return home from Sports Car

Olymplics (SCO) at Boreal Ridge. We had to stop about every hour to let the car recharge. However the Glass Slipper was set with negative camber and it was so much fun to autoX. Bob convinced me that the Glass Slipper was just too impractical to keep – every bolt was always coming loose.

The Cougar found a new home after we were married. It wasn't that much fun to autoX and a neighbor really wanted it.

Bob's 1983 Honda Accord was fun to autox in the rain at a SCO weekend, and it was fun to take camping on the **ESCA** California Tours. But, the most fun to autoX at SCO was the 1993 Accura Integra. However, I did not master trail –braking that weekend. I never did autox Bob's 1970 240Z, but we took it camping on several of the **ESCA** California Tours, the Z held alot. Now might be the perfect time to autoX the 2014 Lexus 350IS Sport; it just got new tires.
