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

Hitting The Wall

It started out innocently enough in the practice session. My usual approach is to keep it floored, trying not to lift, and to use the front tires as brakes. At first they push until they get warm and sticky, then the kart starts sliding until the rear tires come in. Then you can set a fast lap. I got a good run in, with Steve Rossiter, Craig Hammond, and Gary Shannon battling for second. Michael Bundy had his eyes wide open, driving the electric karts for the first time.

When the employees at K1 Speed see a small group of Fast Guys like us, they sometimes join in the fun. Two of them joined in the qual session, starting last and working their way through the field. I saw that I got bumped from the top spot by "Redwolf1204", but I just kept hammering and never looked back. That's why I was surprised when he caught me right at the checkered flag. Where did he come from? "Dirtracer" almost caught me too, and Gary got past CH and SR.









I had the pole for the Main since the employee ringers dropped out. I just had to stay ahead of Gary without putting him in the wall (like I did last time). But looking at DirtRacer's line earlier, I spotted something I wanted to try out. At the entry of the W leading to the Main Straight, instead of sliding up to the left-hand wall, he kept it in the middle of the track. Discipline early, for a faster exit.

I lifted a little earlier, took a tight entry, and dived for the late apex. It was definitely faster. Massive exit speed. I could see it coming—the wall, that is. I hit it right at the entry to pit road, where it has no "give". Ow. The impact lifted the tires into the air. I could hear the motor winding out. Then the kart landed. Ow.

I held on for the win, feeling a bit beat up. Rossiter got back past Gary for second. Hammond was fourth, and Mike B was fifth, but knocked off ½ second over the evening. Ready to do it again next Tuesday? I want to figure out what to do with all that exit speed.

1963: The Year We Started!

A gallon of gas was 30 cents. The average salary was about \$4,400 dollars a year, or about \$84 a week. A 6 pack of beer was \$1.73.

U.S. Auto Production for 1963 was second largest in history. The Beatles released their first album. President John Kennedy was assassinated in Texas. Governor of California in 1963 was Edmund G. Pat Brown. Dr. Martin Luther King gave his "I Have a Dream" speech in Washington D.C. The U.S. Postal Service launched the ZIP code system.

Top songs of 1963: Surfin U.S.A., He's so Fine, Sugar Shack, Rhythm of the Rain, and Walk like a Man.

The Studebaker car company went out of business.

The Sabin oral Polio Vaccine was given nationwide in US.

The population of Santa Rosa in 1963 was bout 50,000 people. Coddingtown Mall opened in 1962

Entry cost of a car rallye was \$2.00. Entry cost of an autocross was about \$2.50.

ESCA was meeting at the EL RANCHO TROPICANA in Room B, on Santa Rosa Avenue, in Santa Rosa (where the Costco Plaza is today).

The Highwaymen's Sports Car Club was the biggest sports car club in Santa Rosa, presenting sports car races at the Sonoma County Airport in 1955-56 and all types of sports car events. It was winding down as **ESCA** came on the scene in 1963.

The **ESCA** treasury was about \$150.

ESCA presented two open rallies in 1963, "Showdown" and "1st Annual Trick or Treat", both rallymastered by Homer Balsley.

Six members of **ESCA** went to the SPORT CAR OLYMPICS at Squaw Valley in 1963.

ESCA had white & blue banners that members flew from their car antenna's on Tours.

The NORTHERN CALIFORNIA SPORTS CAR COUNCIL, (NCSCC) is the coordinating and regulatory authority for all sports car activities in Northern California. Composed of 50 car clubs with nearly 3000 members, the NCSCC in 1963 sanction 46 autocrosses, and gymkhanas, 70 variety rallies, 5 concours d' elegance, 80 T&D rallies and 7 road races sponsored by its member club the San Francisco Region of the SCCA as well as the only event of its kind in the country, the SPORTS CAR OLYMPICS.

Some of the great racing drivers of the day were Dan Gurney, Phill Hill, A.J. Foyt, Stirling Moss, Jim Clark, Graham Hill, and Jackie Stewart.

ESCA's first open event was the "Showdown Rally', which started from Santa Rosa and ended at Lakeside Park in Clearlake. The RallyMaster was Homer Balsley and there were 25 contestants. After the rally was finished most of the contestants and workers headed over Hopland Grade and down 101 back to Santa Rosa. Rallyists and workers at the top of Hopland Grade stopped for a picture.


I had not been to the Coddingtown Cars & Coffee in well over year, and had heard things had really changed, so on Sunday, July 9th I headed over to check it out.
