October is the start of the **ESCA** election process, with the appointment of a three-person **nomination committee** at the **first meeting in October.**

The nomination committee will call or e-mail eligible members to obtain permission to put them on the slate for nomination to the Board.

The nomination committee will present their slate to the membership at the first meeting in November and then additional nominations can be presented at regular meetings.

To be eligible to run for an elective office, a person must be a Regular Active Member, and have been in the club for over 6 months. The minimum age for an elective officer is eighteen.

If you have never been an elected Officer and would like to find out what it is all about, please call or talk to any current Officer.

Serving on the Board is a great way to get more involved in **ESCA** and help out your club. (Contact the **ESCA Secretary** if you need to know your membership status.)



August Go-Kart Event

As most **ESCA** members know by now, the monthly karting events at K1 have been filling in for the autocross enthusiasts. Much appreciation to Charley Sawyer and his team for doing their best to secure a suitable site and/or partner with other groups. **ESCA** supports Charley and team as he works his magic to bring back autocross.

Looking at the upside of substituting cars for karts has resulted in some increasingly competitive events at K1. The monthly gatherings have been attracting only about 10 participants. It has been a good mix of members, some old, some new, with a sprinkling of guests.

Our last event on August 22nd was the 7th of the year and provided no shortage of exciting competition. To add a little interest to the norm, the staff at K1 offered to let us run the course backwards (counter clockwise) from the normal direction. This immediately kicked in new thoughts of how to approach the various turns. As an extra variable, the staff informed us that K1 was transitioning their karts from single wheel drive to a live axel configuration. We were not told which of the karts supported the new configuration. Without getting into the physics of this, the basic difference is sacrificing a







sharp (and easy) turn in ability with one of better acceleration out of the turns. One difference for sure is that the live axel version requires a great deal more effort.

The format was the usual warm up session, followed by a qualifying, and then the 14 lap race. As usual, the race was a gridded start based on qualifying results. The warm up was the usual lower intensity with everyone getting familiar with running backwards. Folks pushed hard in the qualifying event as evidenced by the tight spread of fastest lap times (see list). Congratulations to Tony Schliemann for his fastest lap time. The race started out maintaining the original grid until Charlie

had a mechanical failure (broken axel) stopping all action. After Charlie was taken care of and the race resumed, it was a chaotic session with some aggressive driving until the end. Several bumps, spins, and pile-ups resulted in a flurry of passing and lapping. At this point there was much confusion of who was in the lead and who really finished first. While the author may have had the fastest lap (and authoring privileges), I can assure you that I was passed multiple times. We can only speculate on who was the true winner. (Feature Race Results)

Twenty-Five Years Ago in Pit Stop October 1998
