Robert's Roundtable 2025



Before I try my hand at door-to-door sim-racing against live competitors, I want to make sure that my simulator set-up is adequate, and that I feel competent enough in using it. To that end, I've been putting in miles in Dirt Rally 2.0, a punishing rally sim that does little to hold new players' hands as they set stage times in a variety of terrains and conditions and try to beat times set by AI competitors.

It's been brutal. Most racing games will forgive the occasional rookie mistake; Dirt offers no such kindness. Dipping a tire off the gravel in the wrong spot is likely to send the car sliding into a ditch, which may call for a tow truck and a penalty. Hitting a rock or landing too hard on one corner will bend suspension components or cause a tire puncture, either of which will cripple the car until it's replaced. Clutching-out before fully seating a gear will cause the synchros to howl in pain and damage the transmission until you pop it back into neutral and try again. Any lapse in attention to your co-driver's pace notes will almost certainly end with your car wrapped around a tree or rolling down a mountain. When I was able to complete a stage, it was usually with two bent tie rods, a cracked radiator, a whining sound from the transmission, and nearly a minute in penalties.

Dirt does offer the player a chance to try again, of course. However, the player only receives a fixed number of mulligans per rally, an average of one per stage. When I would retry a stage, I was just as likely to wreck the car in some new and innovative way as I was to improve my stage time.

Frustrated, I abandoned the game for a week. When I returned, I tried to exercise some patience and exploit the game's one kindness: I would drive the stage once, at a pace that felt comfortable, to make note of potential trouble spots. Then, I would see approximately how much time I needed to shave off to compete with the AI drivers' times, and use my mulligan for a flat-out attack run on a slightly more familiar stage.

When I tried this, however, something strange happened: my "slow" run was 2nd fastest on the stage compared to the AI

drivers. I saved my mulligan and continued to the next stage. Similar results. Third stage. At this point, I was getting a bit cocky. A row of hay bales on the outside of a hairpin turn quickly checked my ego. I used one of the three retries I now had banked and took it slower, especially through the hairpins. 1st place on the stage, continuing to 1st overall.

At some point in all of this, I remembered an oxymoronic piece of advice I had heard years ago when trying to learn a new skill: "Slow is Smooth, Smooth is Fast." The sentiment is old. The Roman historian Suetonius writes it as Festina Lente, or "Make Haste Slowly," and says that Caesar Augustus would quote an even older Greek version of the phrase as a warning against rushing an important task.

Augustus, of course, was not a motorsport enthusiast, but this proverb still rings true in our hobby. Trying to drive like Colin McRae straight off the bat was ingraining bad habits and not allowing me to make progress. The single biggest improvement in my sim rally and Autocross performance came as I learned how to apply throttle, steering, and brake inputs smoothly under pressure, which I was able to practice when I stopped worrying about my individual run time.

Racing is exciting. It's tempting to charge headfirst into an exciting new challenge with reckless abandon, but racing is also a discipline. Without a willingness to slow down and learn, we can't expect to grow in it.




